Public Safety:

Over the past week, 140 Public Safety incidents occurred in town, which included the following:

Public Works:***Streets and Storm:***

Crew Emphasis:

The crew continued sign maintenance; street sweeping; catch basin cleaning; disassembled, cleaned, and stored the snow and ice control equipment; and performed other maintenance activities.

Rigney Road Nonmotorized Improvements Project:

The contractor, engineers, and staff inspected the project and created a punch list of remaining items for the contractor to complete. We are still awaiting WSDOT approval of the sidewalk railing prior to installation.

Rainier Street Preservation Project:

The contractor continued installation of storm pipe and structures east of Balch Street. This work will continue into next week after which the contractor will commence demolishing and reconstructing curb ramps.

Old Military Road Preservation Project:

Survey work continued this week in support of the design of the project. Preliminary design is currently underway.

Annual Town Roadside Herbicide Applications and Vegetation Maintenance:

The Town's annual application of herbicides to combat weeds along road shoulders has started and will continue through August along with vegetation maintenance. Targeted noxious weeds and brush control applications will occur through the end of November as needed. Only federal and state-approved herbicides are used.

The Town uses Cheetah Pro and Scythe along rights-of-way adjacent to roads and Mirimichi and Scythe on sidewalks. (The Town previously discontinued the use of Round-up.) Both are applied only by certified pesticide applicators using manufacturer's recommendations and under the guidance and inspection of the USDA. The applicable Safety Data Sheets are available on the Town's official website.

Electrical:

Crew Emphasis:

The crew finished installing conduit at the Public Works facility as part of the EV charging station installation; performed a utility disconnection in the 2700 block of Cambridge Drive for a panel and meter base change out; performed annual bucket truck safety training; performed transformer maintenance; and performed other maintenance activities.

Water/Sewer:

Crew Emphasis:

The crew assisted the Electric crew with the installation of conduits at the Public Works facility; cleaned wet wells at lift stations at various locations throughout Town; completed utility locates in support of the Old Military Road project design; reviewed submitted engineering plans for the Bradford Plat and a new proposed plat on Division Lane within the sewer service area; and performed other maintenance activities.

Parks, Buildings and Grounds:

Crew Emphasis:

The crew reviewed specifications for a new mower; estimated and ordered fall material for various playgrounds; continued mowing and grounds maintenance as weather allowed; and performed other maintenance activities.

SHS Music Program Fundraiser:

ATM Services:

ATM services are available at the Public Works Facility, 1030 Roe Street, Steilacoom, WA during normal business hours – 8 AM to Noon Monday through Friday.

Safety Messages:

Smoke Alarms—Test your smoke alarms every month and replace the battery at least once a year. If the alarm makes a "chirping" sound, replace the battery immediately.

Carbon Monoxide Detectors—Anything that burns fuel can potentially become a source of carbon monoxide, an invisible, odorless gas that can kill. CO alarms should be installed in a central location outside each bedroom and on every level of the home. The safety tips for CO detectors mirror those of smoke alarms: change the batteries and test them.

Family Emergency Plan—Every family should have an emergency plan in place in the event of a natural disaster or other catastrophic event. It is recommended that all homes have an emergency kit including the following: one gallon of water per day for each person, at least a three-day supply of food, flashlight, and batteries, first aid kit, filter mask, plastic sheeting and duct tape, and medicines.

Get Rid of Unwanted Medicines—NSC recommends you take unwanted or expired medicines to a prescription drop box or take-back event near you.

Getting the Urge to Clean?—With the warm weather comes a desire to shine and polish your home. But when warning labels are ignored or chemicals fall into the wrong hands, disaster can occur. Learn what you can do to keep you family safe around poisons in the home.

Window Safety—With warmer temperatures arriving, it's important to practice window safety – especially in homes with young children.
